Talk to friends and neighbors

Write letters to the editor

Attend town board meetings just to observe. There's no need to speak up right away. If asked, you are simply curious as to whether there is any conversation about gas drilling

Create and use "privilege of the floor" at all possible levels of government

Collect donations for your group

Volunteer to research gas leases for mapping

Circulate the **Statewide Ban Petition** (see [un-naturalgas.org/organizers.htm](http://un-naturalgas.org/organizers.htm)) and mail it in

Hang up posters for events

Neighborhood showings of movies at home - invite friends, neighbors, colleagues, workmates

If you're a churchgoer, club member, etc, see where your organization is on the issue

Boycott or reduce your use of natural gas

Look for ways to use less electricity

Organize a fundraiser

Help with [GasWatch](#)

Leave a single concise sheet with your postmaster. Days later, ask if THEY will put up it on the corkboard, or let you leave a little stack on the counter in the lobby

Guerilla Marketing: leave postcards, info on shelves in stores, newspapers, on bulletin boards, flyers on cars

Make and hang signs everywhere

Wear buttons, give buttons out

Ask 3 people a day "What do you think about the gas drilling?" Just listen

Invite people to your local CDOG or other gas opposition meeting
